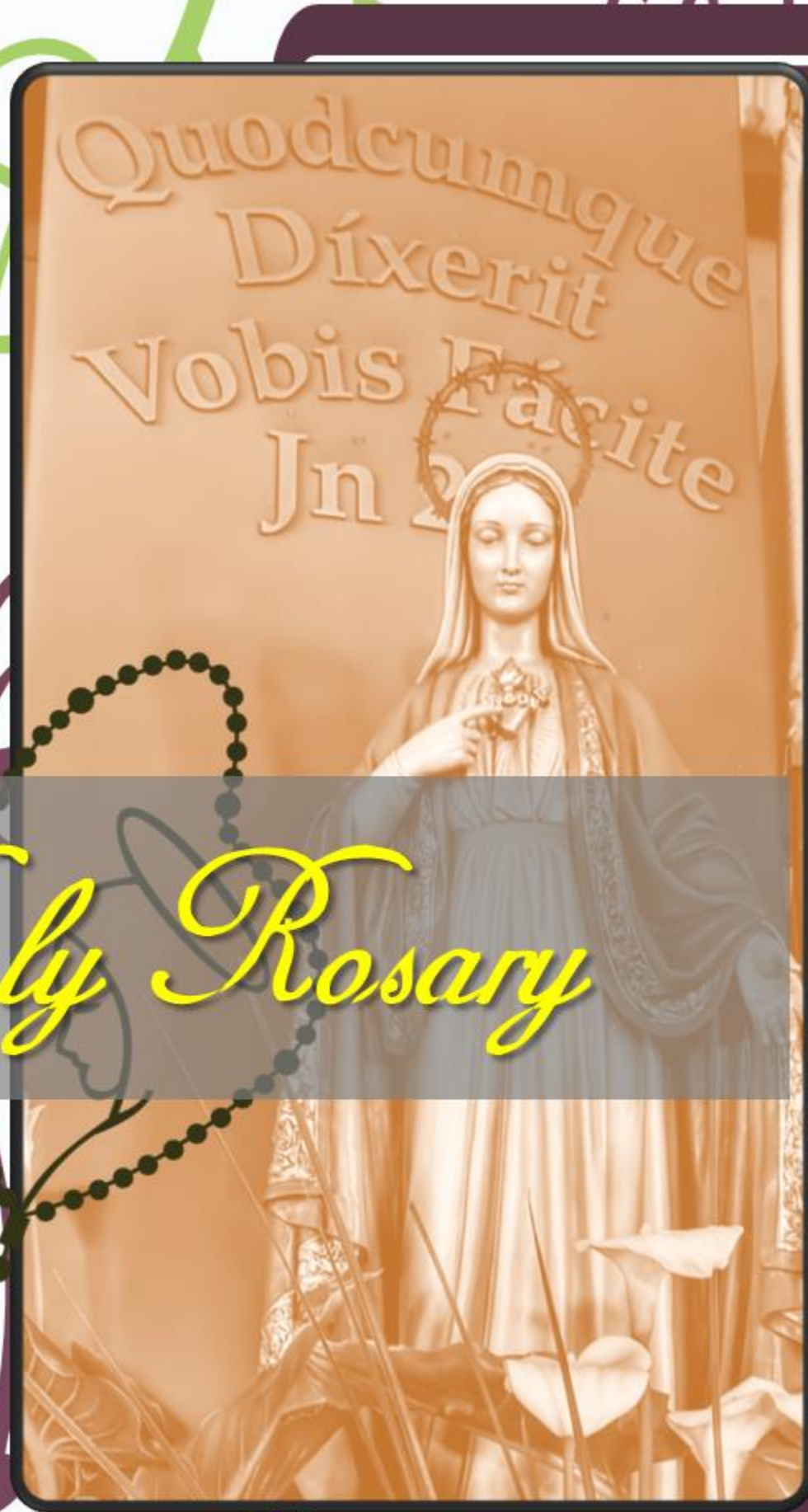

# Holy Rosary



# How to recite the Holy Rosary

1. **Presider:** **IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER** † and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **All:** Amen.
2. **A:** My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.
3. **A:** **I BELIEVE IN GOD**, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into Hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
4. **P.** For an increase of the theological virtues in us, Faith, Hope and Charity:

❖ **P.** *OUR FATHER* Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. **A:** Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. Amen.

❖ **P.** HAIL MARY... full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. **A:** Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen. **(3X).**

❖ **P.** *GLORY BE* to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. **A:** As it was in the beginning is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

❖ **A:** O MY JESUS forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of Hell and lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy. Amen.

❖ **P:** St. Michael the Archangel, **A:** defend us and protect us from all evil. Amen.

**5. P. First Mystery is announced.** (*Spanish and Latin prayers available on last page*).

**6. A:** HAIL HOLY QUEEN, mother of mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn, then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

**P.** *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God,*

**A:** that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

**7. P:** *Let us pray,*

**A:** O GOD, WHOSE only-begotten Son by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life; grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

**8. A:** Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided.

Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

**9. A:** "St. Joseph, help me to be like you. Help me to be obedient to the teachings of the Church and faithful to God's commands. Help me to patiently endure my cross each day. Let me be a model of holiness and a pillar of virtue. I solemnly promise to embrace God's will and I accept the challenge to work tirelessly for my family's salvation. Be my guide and companion on this journey. St. Joseph, Terror of demons, pray for us."

## 10. Prayer for Vocations<sup>1</sup>

O God, Father of all Mercies,  
Provider of a bountiful Harvest,  
send Your Graces upon those  
You have called to gather the fruits of Your labor;  
preserve and strengthen them in their lifelong service of you.

Open the hearts of Your children  
that they may discern Your Holy Will;  
inspire in them a love and desire to surrender themselves  
to serving others in the name of Your son, Jesus Christ.

Teach all Your faithful to follow their respective paths in life  
guided by Your Divine Word and Truth.  
Through the intercession of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary,  
all the Angels, and Saints, humbly hear our prayers  
and grant Your Church's needs, through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

### First Mystery - The Annunciation

### Second Mystery - The Visitation

Mary who is pregnant with Jesus travels to visit her cousin, Elizabeth, who will soon give birth to John the Baptist. Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and said "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb."



### Third Mystery - The Birth of Jesus

Joseph traveled with Mary to Bethlehem to register according to the decree of Emperor Augustus. While there, she gave birth to Jesus, wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger because there is no room in the inn.



### Fourth Mystery - The Presentation

## Luminous Mysteries Thursdays



### First Mystery - The Baptism of Jesus

### Second Mystery - The Wedding at Cana

## Sorrowful Mysteries Tuesdays & Fridays



### First Mystery - The Agony in the Garden

Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane. "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet not my will but yours be done."



### Second Mystery - The Scouring at the Pillar

Then Pilate took Jesus and had Him scourged. From the sole of the foot to the head. Wound and welt... a gaping gash...



### Third Mystery - The Crowning with Thorns

The soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head and a reed in his hand. They dressed Him in a purple robe. They kept coming up to him saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and striking Him on the face.



### Fourth Mystery - The Carrying of the Cross

"... and carrying the cross Himself, He went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, in Hebrew, Golgotha."



### Fifth Mystery - The Crucifixion

## Glorious Mysteries Wednesdays & Sundays\*



### First Mystery - The Resurrection

"Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for He has been raised just as He said. Come and see the place where He lay."



### Second Mystery - The Ascension

So then the Lord Jesus, after He had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God.



### Third Mystery - The Descent of the Holy Spirit

The disciples were in one room when suddenly there came from heaven a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the house. Tongues of fire rest on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit.



### Fourth Mystery - The Assumption

"A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. Upon her death, because Mary was immaculate she was assumed body and soul into heaven."



### Fifth Mystery - The Coronation

"You are the glory of Jerusalem... you are the splendid boast of our people. With your own hand you have done all this... May you be blessed by the Lord Almighty forever and ever!"
