

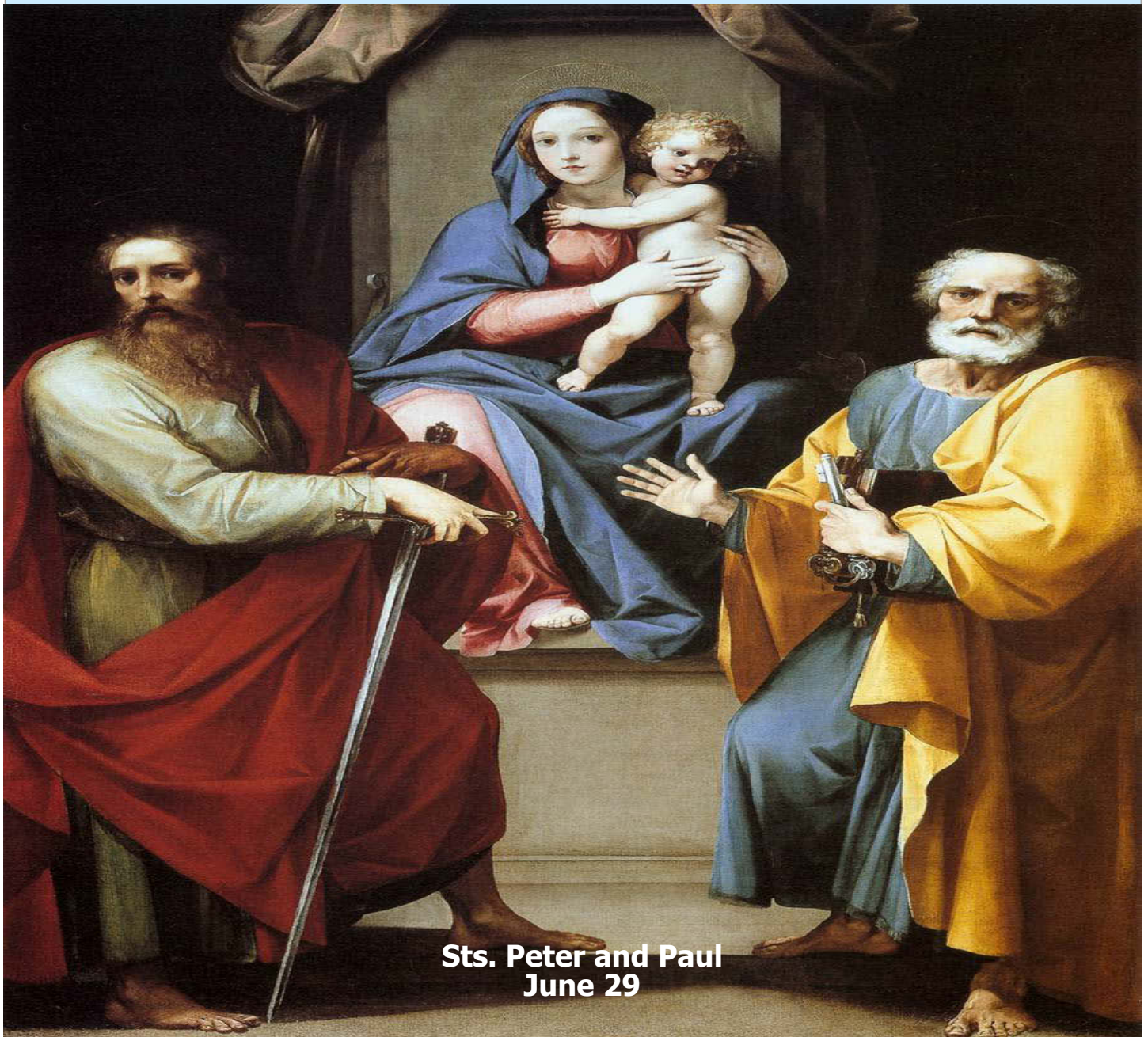

Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

In today's second reading Paul offers a wonderful argument to his converts at Corinth for seeking to help those in need. He is dealing with a practical problem, arranging a collection for the poor of the church of Jerusalem; but as he often does, he develops an important teaching about Jesus to make his point.

After asking that they show their faith by generous gifts, he reminds them of the "gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). In the Incarnation our Lord assumed our human nature, certainly becoming poor for one who is God. The ultimate gracious act of this poverty was going to the cross with all its terrible sufferings. By this act of poverty, we become rich. Now our sins can be forgiven; we can share in the very life of God through the sacraments; we can attain eternal salvation!

While some might approach prayer as if ordering from a menu, the purpose of prayer — be it petition, praise or penitence — is to bring us into an encounter with the God of life who desires the encounter more than we do. Whether we begin by begging God for help for another or from our own need, the real point of the prayer is encounter with God — and all that results from that. The inside story is simply that faith leads to action that generates greater faith.

Queridas familias del Inmaculado Corazon de Maria,

En la segunda lectura de hoy Pablo ofrece un argumento maravilloso a sus convertidos en Corinto para tratar de ayudar a los necesitados. Está tratando con un problema práctico, la organización de una colecta para los pobres de la iglesia de Jerusalén; pero, como hace a menudo, saca una importante lección acerca de Jesús para resaltar un punto.

Después de pedirles que demostraran su fe con generosos donativos, les recuerda lo "generoso que ha sido nuestro Señor Jesucristo, que siendo rico, se hizo pobre por ustedes, para que ustedes se hicieran ricos con su pobreza" (2 Corintios 8:9). Con su encarnación nuestro Señor asumió nuestra naturaleza humana, sin duda haciéndose pobre para uno que es Dios. El último acto de gracia de esta pobreza fue subir a la cruz y sus terribles sufrimientos. Con este acto de pobreza sin duda nos hemos hecho ricos. Ahora nuestros pecados pueden ser perdonados; podemos compartir la vida de Dios por medio de los sacramentos; podemos alcanzar la salvación eterna!

Mientras que algunos se acercan a la oración como si pidieran con un menú, el propósito de la oración -ya sea una petición, una alabanza o una penitencia- es llevarnos a un encuentro con el Dios de la vida que desea el encuentro más que nosotros. Ya sea que comencemos pidiendo a Dios ayuda para otro o por nuestra propia necesidad, el verdadero objetivo de la oración es el encuentro con Dios - y todo lo que resulta de ello. La historia interna es simplemente que la fe llega a la acción que genera mayor fe.

Evangelio

Mc 5, 21-43

En aquel tiempo, cuando Jesús regresó en la barca
al otro lado del lago, se quedó en la orilla y ahí se
le reunió mucha gente. Entonces se acercó uno de
los jefes de la sinagoga, llamado Jairo. Al ver a
Jesús, se echó a sus pies y le suplicaba con
insistencia: "Mi hija está agonizando. Ven a
imponerle las manos para que se cure y viva".
Jesús se fue con él, y mucha gente lo seguía y lo
apretujaba.
Entre la gente había una mujer que padecía flujo
de sangre desde hacía doce años. Había sufrido
mucho a manos de los médicos y había gastado en
eso toda su fortuna, pero en vez de mejorar, había
empeorado. Oyó hablar de Jesús, vino y se le
acercó por detrás entre la gente y le tocó el
manto, pensando que, con sólo tocarle el vestido,
se curaría. Inmediatamente se le secó la fuente de
su hemorragia y sintió en su cuerpo que estaba
curada.
Jesús notó al instante que una fuerza curativa
había salido de él, se volvió hacia la gente y les
preguntó: "¿Quién ha tocado mi manto?" Sus
discípulos le contestaron: "Estás viendo cómo te
empuja la gente y todavía preguntas: ¿Quién me

ha tocado?" Pero él seguía mirando alrededor,
para descubrir quién había sido. Entonces se
acercó la mujer, asustada y temblorosa, al
comprender lo que había pasado; se postró a sus
pies y le confesó la verdad. Jesús la tranquilizó,
diciendo: "Hija, tu fe te ha curado. Vete en paz y
queda sana de tu enfermedad".
Todavía estaba hablando Jesús, cuando unos
criados llegaron de casa del jefe de la sinagoga
para decirle a éste: "Ya se murió tu hija. ¿Para qué
sigues molestando al Maestro?" Jesús alcanzó a oír
lo que hablaban y le dijo al jefe de la sinagoga:
"No temas, basta que tengas fe". No permitió que
lo acompañaran más que Pedro, Santiago y Juan,
el hermano de Santiago.
Al llegar a la casa del jefe de la sinagoga, vio Jesús
el alboroto de la gente y oyó los llantos y los
alaridos que daban. Entró y les dijo: "¿Qué
significa tanto llanto y alboroto? La niña no está
muerta, está dormida". Y se reían de él.
Entonces Jesús echó fuera a la gente, y con los
padres de la niña y sus acompañantes, entró a
donde estaba la niña. La tomó de la mano y le
dijo: "¡Talitá, kum!", que significa: "¡Oyeme, niña,
levántate!" La niña, que tenía doce años, se
levantó inmediatamente y se puso a caminar.
Todos se quedaron asombrados. Jesús les ordenó
severamente que no lo dijeran a nadie y les mandó
que le dieran de comer a la niña.

Gospel

Mk 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat
to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him,
and he stayed close to the sea.
One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came
forward.
Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly
with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death.
Please, come lay your hands on her
that she may get well and live."
He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him
and pressed upon him.

There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for
twelve years.
She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors
and had spent all that she had.
Yet she was not helped but only grew worse.
She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in
the crowd and touched his cloak.
She said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured."
Immediately her flow of blood dried up.
She felt in her body that she was healed of her
affliction.
Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from
him, turned around in the crowd and asked,
"Who has touched my clothes?"
But his disciples said to Jesus,
"You see how the crowd is pressing upon you,
and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?'"
And he looked around to see who had done it.
The woman, realizing what had happened to her,

approached in fear and trembling.
She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole
truth.
He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you.
Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."
While he was still speaking,
people from the synagogue official's house arrived
and said, "Your daughter has died;
why trouble the teacher any longer?"
Disregarding the message that was reported,
Jesus said to the synagogue official,
"Do not be afraid; just have faith."
He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside
except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James.
When they arrived at the house of the synagogue
official, he caught sight of a commotion,
people weeping and wailing loudly.
So he went in and said to them,
"Why this commotion and weeping?
The child is not dead but asleep."
And they ridiculed him.
Then he put them all out.
He took along the child's father and mother
and those who were with him and entered the room
where the child was.
He took the child by the hand and said to her,
"*Talitha koum,*"
which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!"
The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and
walked around.
At that they were utterly astounded.
He gave strict orders that no one should know this
and said that she should be given something to eat.

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24 | 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15 |
Mk 5:21-43 or 5:21-24, 35b-43

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

“Do not be afraid; just have faith.” It’s likely we’ve heard and seen Jesus’ reassuring words or even shared them with others. When I read the story of Jairus and his daughter, I thought of a man with whom I spoke recently. As his lungs failed him during a bout with coronavirus, doctors advised him to say good-bye to his wife and daughters before they placed him on a ventilator. “I was expecting to wake up in heaven,” he said, recalling the moment not as one of fear or panic, but of deep peace. In today’s Gospel passage, Jairus had that kind of “fearless faith” as well, placing his daughter’s life wholly in Jesus’ hands even as others in the crowd ridiculed him. When we pray or ask for God’s healing, we can’t know the outcome. But we can pray for the gifts of faith and courage, placing our lives in God’s loving hands.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

When I was a child, my aunt would always encourage us to make the sign of the cross when we passed an ambulance or accident scene. In her concern for the strangers at the side of the road, my aunt was giving us a lesson in compassion, which stands in marked contrast to the crowds who ridiculed Jairus as he desperately sought help for his daughter. The Church has a rich tradition of intercessory prayer, encouraging us to pray for the needs of others. Today’s readings remind me that we can share our faith by praying for others who are sick, dying, grieving, or struggling in some way. Likewise, we can ask others to pray for us, trusting that God will hear our prayers.

PRAY Do you ever offer to pray for someone and then completely forget? Try writing each person’s name on a Post-it and placing it on your bedside table. Other ideas: Pray the Rosary while driving or exercising, devoting a decade to each person; include prayers for others when you say Grace before meals; as soon as you offer to pray for someone, drop everything and do it!
