Dear Families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

Today's readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in "toil and drudgery" as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God's saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun's "healing rays," and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads.

The destruction of the temple, and the war and persecution, might seem rather terrifying. It is easy in the passage from Luke to focus on the destruction that Jesus promises. But his real promises are not negative and destructive here. Rather, Jesus offers guidance and hope for his followers. First, while the temple itself will be destroyed, Jesus promises that this destruction will not affect the presence of God's Spirit. Jesus assures us that his Spirit will rest upon those of us who need to give testimony before the powers of the world.

Recuerda a los cristianos que los propios apóstoles trabajaron en "trabajo y monotonía" como modelo de cómo debemos contribuir a nuestra comunidad. El Evangelio vuelve al tono apocalíptico de Malaquías, describiendo el caos total del fin de los tiempos. Sabremos que el final está cerca cuando la violencia, la catástrofe y el odio dominen la tierra. ¡Pero no debemos temer! El plan salvador de Dios trae paz a nuestros corazones. Malaquías habla de los "rayos sanadores" del sol, y Jesús mismo promete proteger cada cabello de nuestras cabezas.

La destrucción del templo, y la guerra y la persecución, pueden parecer bastante aterradoras. Es fácil en el pasaje de Lucas enfocarse en la destrucción que Jesús promete. Pero sus verdaderas promesas no son negativas y destructivas aquí. Más bien, Jesús ofrece guía y esperanza a sus seguidores. Primero, aunque el templo mismo será destruido, Jesús promete que esta destrucción no afectará la presencia del Espíritu de Dios. Jesús nos asegura que su Espíritu descansará sobre aquellos de nosotros que necesitamos dar testimonio ante los poderes del mundo.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We don't have to look far to find grief, violence, or chaos in our world. Perhaps it has made its way into our community or has pierced our hearts in deeply personal ways. Or even if the chaos of life has remained at a distance for now, it can be tempting to wonder if the end is near at times. But Jesus warns us against catastrophic thoughts. Listen to what he says in today's Gospel, when asked how we will know the end time is coming: "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Jesus knew we would need his clear and steady reminder. If you find yourself fearing the state of the world, turn all your senses toward Jesus. Let your anxiety, grief, and concern become catalysts for prayer.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Although today's Gospel may at first be one that stirs fear, as we look deeper we realize that Jesus is speaking directly into the heart of our fear and offering his profound consolation. There is so much in this Gospel that can encourage us to continue to bear witness to Christ even in trying times. As we scroll through the news each day, remember Jesus' words to not be "terrified." If you find yourself in circumstances where it's not easy to stand up for your faith, Jesus tells us, "I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute." And when you look to the future with dread, remember that Jesus says, "not a hair on your head will be destroyed." Read these words again, drawing comfort and strength that the Lord is with you, guiding and protecting you through it all.

Jubilee 2025 – Jubilee of the Poor & St. Elizabeth of Hungary

This week, an event of the Jubilee and a saint's memorial line up well together. This is the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, and it is also the 9th World Day of the Poor, and the Jubilee of the Poor. Monday, November 17th, is the Memorial of St. Elizabeth of Hungary, a married and widowed Saint who, although she was a member of the royal family, was well-known for her service to the poor.

Elizabeth was born in July of 1207 in the Kingdom of Hungary, now Bratislava, Slovakia. Her father was King Andrew II of Hungary. At an early age, she was sent to the Court of the rulers of Thuringia in Central Germany, to be raised there and become betrothed to Louis of Thuringia. She and Louis grew up together and were close friends. They were married in 1221. In 1223, Franciscan friars arrived, and Elizabeth not only learned about the ideals of St. Francis of Assisi but also started to live them. She and Louis had plenty of wealth to share, and share it they did!

Louis died of plague on his way to join the Sixth Crusade in 1227. She kept up her work for the poor and took vows as a Franciscan Tertiary. Elizabeth died of illness in November of 1231 at 24. Upon her canonization in 1235, she was declared the patron saint of the Third Order of St. Francis.

In 2016, at the close of the Jubilee of Mercy, Pope Francis established that the 33rd Sunday, the Sunday preceding the Solemnity of Christ the King, would be the World Day of the Poor. This began in November of 2017.

Pope St. Gregory the Great said in a homily, during a crisis in Rome from the barbarian invasions, "Every minute we can find a Lazarus if we seek him, and every day, even without seeking, we find one at our door. Now, beggars besiege us, imploring alms; later, they will be our advocates." Throughout Scripture, God calls on us to care for the poor. It is written into the Old Testament Laws in the Pentateuch. The prophets are often admonishing God's people for their neglect of the poor. Jesus teaches directly and through parables to care for the poor, culminating in His identifying Himself with them: "What you did for the least of these brothers, you did for me"

El lunes 17 de noviembre es la Memoria de Santa Isabel de Hungría, una santa casada y viuda que, aunque era miembro de la familia real, era conocida por su servicio a los pobres.

Isabel nació en julio de 1207 en el Reino de Hungría, ahora Bratislava, Eslovaquia. Su padre fue el rey Andrés II de Hungría. A una edad temprana, fue enviada a la corte de los gobernantes de Turingia en Alemania Central, para ser criada allí y prometida a Luis de Turingia. Ella y Louis crecieron juntos y eran amigos cercanos. Se casaron en 1221. En 1223, llegaron los frailes franciscanos, e Isabel no solo conoció los ideales de San Francisco de Asís, sino que también comenzó a vivirlos. Ella y Louis tenían mucha riqueza para compartir, ¡y la compartieron!

Luis murió de peste en su camino para unirse a la Sexta Cruzada en 1227. Continuó su trabajo por los pobres y tomó votos como terciaria franciscana. Isabel murió de enfermedad en noviembre de 1231 a los 24 años. Tras su canonización en 1235, fue declarada patrona de la Tercera Orden de San Francisco.

En 2016, al final del Jubileo de la Misericordia, el Papa Francisco estableció que el domingo 33, el domingo anterior a la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey, sería la Jornada Mundial de los Pobres. Esto comenzó en noviembre de 2017.

El Papa San Gregorio Magno dijo en una homilía, durante una crisis en Roma por las invasiones bárbaras: "Cada minuto podemos encontrar un Lázaro si lo buscamos, y todos los días, incluso sin buscarlo, encontramos uno a nuestra puerta. Ahora, los mendigos nos asedian, implorando limosna; más tarde, serán nuestros defensores". A lo largo de las Escrituras, Dios nos llama a cuidar de los pobres. Está escrito en las Leyes del Antiguo Testamento en el Pentateuco. Los profetas a menudo amonestan al pueblo de Dios por su descuido de los pobres. Jesús enseña directamente y a través de parábolas a cuidar a los pobres, culminando en su identificación con ellos: "Lo que hicisteis por el más pequeño de estos hermanos, por mí lo hicisteis"

Santa Isabel, ruega por nosotros. ¡Inmaculado Corazón de María, ruega por nosotros!

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Morning Offering, Explained!

There are many variations of the Morning Offering, but all share the same purpose: to begin each day by offering oneself to God, along with all the experiences, struggles and blessings that the day will bring.

The ancient Israelites practiced the bikkurim ("first fruits") as described in Deuteronomy, chapter 26. This was a ritual by which the first fruits of the harvest were offered back to God in a sacrificial act of gratitude and obedience. The theology behind the Morning Offering is similar: giving to God the first moments of each day.

The most traditional form of the Morning Offering, attributed to Fr. François-Xavier Gautrelet, begins "O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day, for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart..." ¡Ofrenda de la mañana, explicada!

Hay muchas variaciones de la Ofrenda de la Mañana, pero todas comparten el mismo propósito: comenzar cada día ofreciéndose a Dios, junto con todas las experiencias, luchas y bendiciones que traerá el día.

Los antiguos israelitas practicaban los bikkurim ("primicias") como se describe en Deuteronomio, capítulo 26. Este era un ritual por el cual los primeros frutos de la cosecha se ofrecían a Dios en un acto sacrificial de gratitud y obediencia. La teología detrás de la Ofrenda de la Mañana es similar: dar a Dios los primeros momentos de cada día.

La forma más tradicional de la Ofrenda de la Mañana, atribuida al P. François-Xavier Gautrelet, comienza "Oh Jesús, a través del Inmaculado Corazón de María, te ofrezco mis oraciones, trabajos, alegrías y sufrimientos de este día, por todas las intenciones de tu Sagrado Corazón..." 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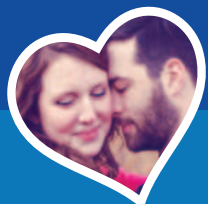
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
